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FINANCE

5 Year Commercial Tax Abatement Bills

The Township offers eligible properties a 5-year phased-in tax abatement program. The abatement is applied to the structure, be it either new structures or additions to existing structures. The first year, property owners will pay no tax on the structure, with each following year being billed at 20% increasing increments (20%, 40%, 60% & 80%) of taxes that would be paid if no abatement was in place. For those property owners participating in the abatement program, you will receive 2 separate and distinct bills: one being from the Finance Office for the abatement payment for the structure, and one from the Tax Collectors Office for land taxes, which are billed at full taxation for all 5 years of the program.

Grants

The Township has always been aggressive in its attempts to obtain grants to fund various projects in an effort to reduce the burden to the local budget. In many instances, these grant awards are received after the municipal budget is adopted. The State, however, provides a mechanism to amend the budget to reflect the grant awards. So far, in 2023 since the final adoption of our budget, we have received grants in the amount of \$311,477.00 for a paving project in Wilton's Corner, \$285,452.00 from the Department of Law and Public Safety for Gunshot Detection Technology, and several other grants that offset public safety and public works costs.

ZONING

A property survey confirms property boundary lines and the legal description of a deed. It will also show other restrictions or easements that may have been conditioned on the property as part of the subdivision process.

Winslow Township Planning and Zoning will have copies of surveys only if work was done in the past that would require such. A new survey can be an added expense, please check with the Township if you are looking for a copy of a survey.

A friendly reminder that a zoning permit application is required before constructing any new structure on your property, including replacing a fence, adding a shed, or extending your driveway. A survey is required as part of this application.

PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD MEETINGS

Winslow Township Planning Board meets the third Thursday of the month, beginning at 7:00pm Winslow Township Zoning Board of Adjustment meets the second Wednesday of the month, beginning at 6:30pm.

MEDIATE DON'T LITIGATE

Mediation is an alternative to resolving disputes in Municipal Court. Trained mediators listen to all sides to help the parties to reconcile or settle disputes without court intervention. Community Dispute Resolution is solution oriented and dedicated to the principal that the settlement of a dispute rests with the disputants themselves. In court, you do not determine the outcome of your case. Through mediation however, parties reach their own solutions. Some examples of the types of cases referred to mediation are: Harassment, theft, trespassing, noise complaints, destruction of property and animal complaints.

Why is Mediation recommended?

- 1. There is no court cost to either party.
- 2. If mediation is successful, the complaint will be dismissed.
- 3. Mediation promotes harmony among disputing parties because these parties play a role in the resolution of their case.
- 4. It's a win/win for all parties involved.

Complaints can be filed with the Municipal Court Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 8:30 am to 3:30 p.m. Mediation is held the first Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m.

BOARD OF HEALTH/VITAL STATISTICS

WE'VE MOVED! The Board of Health/Vital Statistics Department has moved into the main municipal building (across from the Clerk's Office).

The Winslow Township Board of Health assists residents with their health and safety concerns. The department will connect residents with agencies (public/private) that will address issues such as emergency housing, meals for the elderly, medical transportation, senior services, overdue gas/electric bills and assist residents in resolving their hazmat complaints.

The Winslow Township Vital Statistics Department is here to help residents acquire certified copies of birth, marriage, and death certificates. Please call 609-567-0700 ext. 8008 or ext. 7002 to schedule an appointment.





CODE ENFORCEMENT/ANIMAL CONTROL

Winslow Township Code Enforcement Department focuses on neighborhood preservation. The property maintenance code is an essential part of maintaining the appearance and integrity of Winslow Township. This code holds property owners responsible for the upkeep of their properties. The main goal of the code enforcement program is to bring to the attention of residential and business owners any existing code violations that could have a negative impact on their property, neighborhood, and the community.

Code Enforcement is implemented on a complaint driven basis and through routine and proactive enforcement of municipal ordinances. Some violations include trash or debris accumulated on a property, property maintenance violations such as high grass, dead trees,

overgrown shrubbery blocking sidewalks, vehicles parked on lawn and inoperable vehicles. For complaints or inquiries, you can email sheinz@winslowtownship.com or call 609-567-0700 extension 7002.

The Animal Control Department provides many animal-related services to the residents of Winslow Township. Animal Control will respond to complaints of dogs running at large, confined animals, nuisance animals, and animal cruelty. This department also handles feral cats by trapping and taking to Homeward Bound Animal Shelter. Animal Control will also investigate reports of an animal bite and report it to the Camden County Board of Health Department. What OEM Does:

EMERGE

Winslow Township's Office of Emergency Management helps all members of our community **BEFORE, DURING,** and **AFTER** emergencies and other incidents through Preparedness, Education, Response and Recovery.

Your OEM agency is responsible for coordinating Township-wide emergency planning and response for all types and scales of emergencies and major incidents.

OEM is staffed by dedicated professionals with diverse backgrounds and expertise in Law Enforcement, Firefighting, and Emergency Medical Services.

OEM coordinates with Township Government as well as with all Winslow Township emergency first-responders including our Camden County, State and Federal partners.



WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Now that you have a better understanding of Emergency Management, you may be thinking what YOU can do to support our mission of Preparedness, Education, Response and Recovery.

- **Preparedness:** Keep emergency supplies in the form of a disaster preparedness kit ("Go Bag") which will provide you with all the items you need to survive for a minimum of 72 hours. Ready.Gov and the American Red Cross provide excellent kit suggestions.
 - **Education:** Get informed. Signup for alerts and warnings, such as My Winslow, Nixle/ Everbridge, Fema.Gov, etc., to receive vital information during an emergency.
 - **Response:** Understand how your medical, physical and cognitive needs may affect your ability to respond to a disaster or emergency. Sign up for NJ Register Ready.
 - **Recovery:** Build your support network and identify family, friends, neighbors, caregivers and others who may be able to assist you during times of crisis.

HOW TO RESPOND DURING A DISASTER -The 3 Most Important Things To Do:

- 1. **Stay Informed** Monitor news and emergency alerts for updates and guidance.
- 2. **Stay or Go** Be ready to either hunker down at home or leave at the direction of the Authorities.
- 3. Ask for Help Do not hesitate to call for assistance and be as precise as possible when explaining your needs.

HOW TO RECOVER AFTER A DISASTER -The 3 Most Important Things To Do:

- 1. **Return Home Safely** only after the Authorities say it's safe to return.
- 2. Work with Trusted Sources American Red Cross, Salvation Army, FEMA, Local Government and your Faith-Based Organizations.
- 3. **Manage your Property Damage** Fully document any property damage for insurance purposes. Also, work with local agencies to remove and sort debris as advised.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

Doing work on your home? Did you know, you may qualify for a Five-Year Residential Abatement?

Here is what you should know:

- 1. Residential single-family properties fifteen (15) years of age or older.
- 2. Property owners will have 30 days from the date of completion to file the application with the Assessor's Office.
- 3. Up to \$25,000 of the Tax Assessor's full and true value of the improvement may be abated (exempt) from property taxes for 5 years, for those who take out proper project permits.
- 4. There is no application fee required for this program.
- 5. Applications are available from the Construction Office or the Assessor's Office when you apply for the permit.

Full prerequisites and qualifications can be found in the Code of the Township Chapter 66. Questions regarding this program should be directed to the Assessor's Office @ 609-567-0700 option #9.

Property Tax Deduction? Do you qualify?

The State of New Jersey, administered through the Assessor's Office, provides property tax deductions to Veterans, Widows of Veterans, Senior Citizens, Disabled Persons and Widows of Seniors and Disabled Persons. Each deduction has specific qualifications/prerequisites that must be met and requires the filing of an application.

Daniel's Law

Daniel's Law was enacted in response to the tragic death of Daniel Anderl, the son of Judge Esther Salas and Mark Anderl. The law prohibits disclosure of the residential addresses of certain persons covered by the law ("Covered Persons")

on websites controlled by state, county, and local government agencies. The community of Covered Persons includes former, active, and retired judicial officers, prosecutors, and members of law enforcement and their immediate family members residing in the same household.

AM I A COVERED PERSON? A Covered Person is an active, inactive, or retired, state or federal, judge, prosecutor or member of prosecutor or member of law enforcement.



OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPAL CLERK

The Clerk's Office is a major source of information for our residents. The Municipal Clerk and her staff serve as a liaison between the community and the Township.

What types of licenses does the Clerk's Office issue?

Kennel licenses, pet licenses, shooting gallery & range licenses, towing licenses, trailer court licenses, bingo/ raffle licenses, business licenses, solicitor's licenses, alarm permits, yard sale permits, taxicab licenses, limousine licenses, clothing bin licenses and liquor licenses.

Who do I contact to use a Township field or park?

The Clerk's Office issues permits for the use of Township parks and/or fields for sports teams and residents. Please note: To obtain permits for the New Brooklyn Park on Erial Road, please call 856-216-2117 or visit www.camdencounty. com/parks.

How can I get a copy of a public record?

The Municipal Clerk is responsible for and processes all Open Public Records Act (OPRA) applications. OPRA requests are responded to within seven (7) business days.

Where can I register to vote?

The Municipal Clerk is the Administrator of Elections and forms are available to register to vote, change your address, change party affiliation and request vote by mail ballots.

Are you have non-profit group and need a place meet?

The Clerk's office also schedules the use of the Bud Duble Senior Center and the Star Building.

Any other services provided by the Clerk's Office? We also offer free notary service.



CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT

Purpose Of Permits: The proper permit serves as protection against contractors who may not follow mandated laws promulgated for consumer protection and is also important for insurance purposes. All home improvement contractors must be registered by the State of New Jersey. For your protection, prior to hiring a contractor, please make sure they have proper licenses and registrations at http://www.njconsumeraffairs.gov. If you sign the permit application and allow an unregistered or unlicensed contractor to perform work at your home, you are assuming all responsibility.

Rental Property Registration: All residential rental properties are required to be registered and inspected prior to occupancy. Following initial registration and inspection, all rental properties are required to be registered annually and inspected annually or when there is a change of occupancy, whichever occurs first.

Dumpster /**Container Permits:** Storage containers, pods, and dumpsters require a permit for placement on private property. No person shall place or leave any dumpster on any public street, sidewalk, or alley without first obtaining the proper permit and approval from our Police Department.

Beginning late fall 2023, Winslow Township residents will begin receiving new Smart Meter upgrades. This upgrade comes as part of Atlantic City Electric's effort to build a new Smart Energy Network throughout its service area, which will enhance the reliability of your energy service, provide better information during outages and support new tools and programs to help you save money and energy. A full list of frequently asked questions can be found at atlanticcityelectric.com/SEN.

Some things to keep in mind:

- You will receive a post card within of a few months of your upgrade and a letter within a few weeks of your installation. Approximately one week prior to your meter upgrade, Atlantic City Electric will call to remind you that your meter is scheduled for an upgrade. You can also receive reminders by signing up for text alerts in My Account at atlanticcityelectric.com/MyAccount or through Atlantic City Electric's mobile app.
- On the day of your meter upgrade, a representative from Atlantic City Electric's upgrade contractor, CCI, will knock on your door to let you know that your upgrade will take place. The contractor will carry approved Atlantic City Electric identification.
- You do not need to be home for the upgrade. However, if you normally need to give a meter reader access to your meter, please contact Atlantic City Electric at 1-800-642-3780 to schedule an appointment. Your meter location will also not be moved.
- Upgrades will take place Monday through Friday and will take no more than 30 minutes.
- You may experience a brief service outage lasting no more than a few minutes while the new meter is being installed. If there is any life-support equipment in use at this address, it is important that you notify us prior to your meter upgrade by calling 1-800-642-3780.
- Atlantic City Electric will leave a doorhanger letting you know that the upgrade was completed. If the upgrade is unable to be completed, the doorhanger will provide a number to call for an appointment.

COUNTY ROAD PROJECTS

Anticipated projects in Winslow Township include roadway and design improvements to W. Fleming Pike from Route 73 to the Gloucester County Border, and Mays Landing Road from AC Expressway to the Atlantic County border. We anticipate construction for those projects to also begin in spring 2024. Please check the township website for updates.

Sicklerville Roundabout: Construction will be performed in three stages. In the first stage, which is anticipated to begin in spring 2024, the center portion of the roundabout will be constructed between Sicklerville and Erial Roads, and both roadways will remain open to traffic. The second phase will close Erial Road to traffic, detouring traffic to Sicklerville Road. The third stage will close Sicklerville Road and detour traffic to Erial Road. Temporary lane closures or lane shifts are anticipated during each of these phases. At certain times overnight, one roadway may be closed to traffic. Detours will be provided to direct motorists to use alternate routes.

Cooler Air and Beautiful Leaves ...

Fall is the perfect time to enjoy Winslow Township Parks and walking paths. Our website list all of our parks as well as what each has to offer.

With daylight decreasing faster now you may notice street lights that are in need of repair. Street lights that are out, flickering, or dimming can be reported to Atlantic City Electric on their website under the outage tab. You will then have the option to enter the pole number or the address closest to the light with an issue. Once you enter the information and submit, they will send an email back a confirmation email and send out someone to repair.

The 2023 Fall Leaf collection is listed below. Leaves MUST be out on the first day of your scheduled week pick up to guarantee collection. We are able to service each street once during the scheduled week. Leaves must be free of branches, twigs, trash, and acorns as they will clog the machine and we will not be able to collect them. Do not park vehicles on top of or close to the leaf piles on your street as this will prevent our vehicles and crew from collecting them. The dates listed are the only dates for collection.

Bulk collection consists of furniture items, large plastic toys, bathtub, toilets that are placed out in two separate pieces by unbolting the back, and carpet that is cut into 4-foot length or less, rolled, and tied or taped into bundles less than 45 lbs. Please call our department should you have a question regarding a specific item you have. If any pieces of furniture have glass, please place an "x" going across both sides of the glass with a heavy-duty tape. No construction type debris, extra containers of trash, or extra bags will be collected curb side on your trash day or bulk day.

Electronic Disposal - TV's, computers, printers, and other electronics would need to be brought to Public Works during normal business hours. Electronics are not picked up curbside. When you come to Public Works stop in the office in the small trailer and we can direct you where to go for drop off after you sign in, valid ID with residency in Winslow are required. No businesses will be able to drop off anything at our facility.

Batteries - Lithium-ion (Li-ion) batteries and devices containing these batteries should not go in household garbage or recycling bins. They can cause fires during transport or at landfills and recyclers. Instead, Li-ion batteries should be taken to household hazardous waste collection points.

Winslow Township issued toters are to be kept at the residential home where they were delivered. We ask residents to place the address on the toters to allow for easier identification. In the event your toter is cracked, wheels are damaged, or lids are breaking please call our department at 609-567-0700 option 2 or send an email to publicworks@ winslowtownship.com so we can assist with repairs. Lost,



stolen, or missing toters will require a police report as well as a fee.

TOTER PLACEMENT: The truck and robotic arm is large and needs space to operate and the carts must be separated by adequate space (3 feet) to allow the robotic toter grabber (clamp) to grab and dump toter. If toters

are too close to one another, or too close to a fixed object (car, mailbox) the toter cannot be picked up and dumped. Toters must be at the curb by 7AM for pickup. If toters are not placed where lid opens facing the collection truck they will not be dumped.



Snow Removal Information and Guidelines

Our Public Works Department is working hard to make driving safer and easier in snowy weather. Depending on the duration and amount of snowfall, township trucks may plow your street several times. As snow rolls off our plows, it will accumulate in driveways. Please understand that this is unavoidable, and it is the homeowner's responsibility to clear it. Here are some helpful hints to make "snow" business less frustrating:

- Shovel snow to the right side of your driveway (facing the street) to minimize the amount of snow entering your driveway. If possible, wait until the township trucks have made at least two passes on your street before clearing your driveway. Shovel and/or blow snow onto the curb, not into the street.
- DO NOT PARK cars on the street from one hour after snow has continuously fallen until 12 hours after snow has stopped. This speeds the removal process and prevents cars from being plowed in.
- To ensure safety of pedestrians, residents must remove snow from sidewalks following a snow fall. Please remember that children are walking to school and bus stops are all over town.

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FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS CONTINUED

- In the event of deep snow, please shovel around your mailbox and fire hydrants near your house for your safety and your neighbors'.
- Not all roads in Winslow Township are maintained by the township. During bad weather, we often receive calls from our residents about the condition of roads whose maintenance is the responsibility of Camden County or the state.
- Route 30, Route 73 and Spring Garden Road are maintained by the State of New Jersey:

Snow removal, potholes, deer carcass, highway litter, malfunctioning traffic signals, highway street lights, high grass, damaged/missing signs, guardrail damage or other maintenance problem on state roads can be reported by calling 1. 800.Pothole.

NO GREASE DOWN THE SINK

Grease is a byproduct of cooking. It comes from meat, lard, oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, baking goods, sauces, and dairy products.

What's the Problem?

When grease washes down the sink, it sticks to the insides of the pipes. Eventually, the grease can build up until it completely blocks sewer pipes. That can create expensive maintenance problems and can cause raw sewage to back up into your home or business, or overflow into streets and streams.

How Can You Help?

- Don't pour grease down sink drains or toilets.
- Scrape grease into the trash.
- Or, pour grease into steel cans, let it harden, and throw in the trash.



NO WIPES DOWN THE PIPES

Wipes, cloths, and rags are being found in sanitary sewers at an ever-increasing rate. Many of these products are labeled as flushable, but while they may clear the toilet, they will most likely cause problems downstream.

What's the Problem?

Wet wipes, cloths, and rags don't actually break down the way toilet paper does, and can block pipes, cause mechanical problems at pump stations or treatment plants, and pollute the environment.

How Can You Help?

PROCEDURES FOR A SEWER SERVICE PROBLEM

Occasionally a homeowner will experience a problem with their sewer service; i.e., lateral blocked, drain lines not draining or draining extremely slowly.

As the owner you are responsible for your sewer lateral from the house to the street. A backup may be internal, or it may be from the sewer main located in the street.

It is recommended to contact Winslow Township Utilities first before contacting a plumber by calling (609) 567-0700 Monday thru Friday 8:30 am – 4:30 pm

Winslow Township Utilities will check the sewer lines in the street and will advise you if it is necessary to contact a plumber.

Please be aware, that once a resident contacts a plumber, the resident is responsible for all costs associated with the plumber fees, etc.

Road Openings ... Did You Know?

Did you know that Winslow Township manages hundreds of road opening permits every year? We wanted to take a moment to highlight a largely overlooked but very important service that Winslow provides. When a company needs to repair or install a utility such as gas, electric, cable, phone or sewer lines they often need to cut into a Winslow Township owned road.

In order to "open up" a Township Road we require a permit so we can monitor the work and make sure the road is repaired correctly since our residents need and deserve safe and drivable streets.

Each time a road is dug up, Public Works, inspects the work and ensures the township guidelines are followed. Recently public utilities have dug up large sections of Edan Hollow and Primrose Gate. To ensure that the roads are left in a safe condition the Township required that the roads be repaved at no cost to Winslow. On smaller street openings the Township requires that contractors fix just the openings they made in accordance to current standards.



This is all done to ensure that our roads remain safe and accessible for our residents and the motoring public in general.

ROAD PROJECTS

Under the direction of Mayor Marie Lawrence, the Department of Public Works plans, manages, and coordinates paving projects throughout Winslow Township. This past summer Winslow completed a large roadway preservation project in Oak Forest. This project consisted of the resurfacing of all of the roads interior to the development, structural repairs to the road as needed, new ADA compliant ramps installed at each intersection and new line striping for crosswalks.

The next project that is being planned is a roadway preservation project in Wilton's Corner which will include the resurfacing of Meetinghouse Circle. The Township received grants from the New Jersey Department of Transpiration for both projects.

Currently Camden County is continuing with the widening of Cross Keys Road. This is a massive project that has been in the design phase for many years and is now well under way. The County started this project at Erial Road and Cross Keys and has been moving North in phases. The current phase under construction is through the Albion section of town from the County Technical School to the vicinity of Turnersville Rd. Camden County is also in the process of designing Mays Landing Road for repairs and resurfacing of the entire length of the road within Winslow Township. Camden County has further committed to repair and resurface West Fleming Pike from Rt. 73 to the Township border with Gloucester County.

We will provide more details as the County moves forwards with their planning.

To our residents: We are a combination Fire Department consisting of both Volunteer and Career firefighters serving the community 24/7 from 5 fire stations and our Headquarters Facility covering nearly 60 square miles. Along with responding to calls, the Fire Department is very engaged in the community; participating in public

education/relations events, supporting many charity events and Fire Code Enforcement, along with an aggressive smoke alarm inspection program for our residents.

We would like to remind everyone to change the batteries in their smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms or purchase the sealed battery models. An operable detector is truly a lifesaver! We recommend that you replace your units every 10 years. How can you help us????

- Please keep your address posted and visible to view from the street to assist us in finding you.
- Do not obstruct fire hydrants and when it snows please shovel a 5-foot perimeter around the closest hydrant.
- Practice home fire drills and know two ways out of a house or building.
- Do not hesitate to call for the Fire Department should your Smoke or Carbon Monoxide Alarms activate!

The Fire Department is continuously trying to recruit interested individuals to volunteer as Firefighters. We are experiencing CRITICAL SHORTAGES and require the community's assistance to join our team to protect OUR Community. Volunteers make up a large portion of our emergency operations. We offer:


We are excited to introduce Sharee Shiver as our new Tax collector. Some of you may know Sharee from coming to pay in person. Sharee came to the office 4 years ago as a Clerk. She worked hard and earned her Tax Collectors certification. Sharee is ready and excited to begin her new position as your Winslow Township Tax Collector.

Did you know... The Winslow Township Tax office is governed by the State of NJ? All municipalities are required by the state to have a State certified Tax Collector in place. As a statutory officer of the State, the collector is responsible to follow all the state statutes regarding tax collection which include but not limited to billing, due dates, and interest on delinquencies. No one has the authority to forgive interest on delinquent taxes. Please mark your calendars of the due dates. The first of February, May, August and November. Delinquent taxes create additional burden on the Township which in turn effects the tax rate and obligates this office to collect interest. Interest is charged at 8% on the first

\$1500.00 and 18% on delinquencies over \$1500.00. Please pay by the first or within the statutory 10-day grace period allowed.

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


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
