Robert Eardley, Braddock Preserve – He requested the Governing Body re-visit the water & sewer charges. He stated the Township is rationing the water. He believes the water & sewer charges are unfair and call it a “hidden tax”. He also complimented the Governing Body and Mr. White.

Mark Testa, 33 Red Fox Trail – He is glad to see that the Governing Body is taking care of senior citizens.

Eric Fooder, 25 Susan Lane – He stated the Township needs to increase revenues to improve the water system. He supports the Ordinance.

Herman Bethea, Winslow Township – He questioned what the Ordinance means.

Mayor Metzner explained the Ordinance increases the income requirement from \$10,000.00-\$15,000.00 in order to help more seniors, as well as the totally disabled, in order to receive a water rate discount.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Metzner closed the hearing to the public.

**COMMENTS FROM OFFICIALS:**

Mayor Metzner stated the income increase will help more people. She stated the Utilities Department is self-sustaining and not paid by tax dollars. Mayor Metzner added Mr. Dringus has looked at many scenarios to build revenue for the water & sewer. She also explained the NJDEP enforced the water charges. She explained there is a loss of connection fees and therefore the water & sewer department’s only revenue is usage charges.

Committeeman Wright stated he is concerned that seniors are worrying about how much water they are using. This Ordinance is meant to help the seniors and he supports the same.

Committeeman Bates stated the budget is based on each person using the water.
