Committeeman Wilson reported DPW is cleaning up parks and making field preparations. Opening ceremonies for Winslow Township Little League at Stella Maiese Memorial Park is April 18<sup>th</sup>.

Department of Municipal Utilities: **(Director Flamini)**

Committeeman Flamini reported there were 10 broken pipe calls this winter. A pump was replaced in Well #4. The Spring water main flushing starts May 4<sup>th</sup>.

Administration: **(Director Lawrence)**

Committeewoman Lawrence deferred to Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. Gallagher went over his report.

EDC

Mr. Gallagher reported that economic development is doing tremendous as evidenced on Cross Keys Road and Route 73. He has been working with the State's Economic Development Authority on enhancing new manufacturing jobs in the Township.

CDBG

Mr. Gallagher reported the Township was awarded a grant which will be used to upgrade the HVAC system at senior citizens center.

Green efforts

Mr. Gallagher reported the Green Fair is this Saturday at the Municipal Building.

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Mr. Gallagher reported that Churchill Engineers will be requesting authorization to advertise for bids on April 28<sup>th</sup> for sidewalk upgrades on Williamstown and Sicklerville Roads.

Quality of Life Issues

Mr. Gallagher reported code enforcement and animal control officers are working with the police department to maintain the Township's quality of life.

Tax Assessing: **(Director Tomasello)**

Committeeman Tomasello reported the Tax Assessor's office received 155 appeals, of which 13 are commercial. Tax appeal hearings will be held in June.

Senior Citizens: **(Director Leverett)**

Committeewoman Leverett reported the membership drive has been extended until April 30<sup>th</sup>. *Zumba* may be coming to the senior center.

Public Safety: **(Director Mayor Wright)**

Mayor Wright reported the police responded to 375 calls in March. The police department will host "Coffee with a Cop" event on April 25<sup>th</sup> at the McDonald's on Cross Keys Road. The police department is also hosting a Jr. Police Academy Day Camp from July 20<sup>th</sup> -24<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm. Applications are available in the police department. Mayor Wright commended Chief Stimelski and his staff. The police department has joined the Mayor at the food bank every 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of the month at School #3. Officer O'Rourke will be speaking to students regarding prom night. Mayor Wright also reported Level II commendations were issued to detectives for solving several burglaries and thefts. Mayor Wright added the police department has an anonymous tip line number 609-561-0895.

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Committeeman Pleczynski reported the municipal budget was introduced on March 24<sup>th</sup> and adoption is scheduled for April 28<sup>th</sup>. He also reported the 2012 Homestead rebates have been applied to the 2015 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter taxes. Reimbursement applications are due June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Mayor Wright reported the South County Regional Library is celebrating “National Library Week” this week. Special events are taking place each day to celebrate.

The library recently announced an addition of 800 new titles to their book collection.
