Committeeman Flamini reported on the activities of the water and sewer department, including the repairs at Lehigh Manor which are now complete.

Administration: **(Director Lawrence)**

Committeewoman Lawrence deferred to Mr. Gallagher.

I&I Project

Mr. Gallagher reported the County is offering 30-year loans with 0% interest, to which the Township will be looking into. He added the project at Lehigh Manor saves 100,000 gals. of water daily.

EDC

Mr. Gallagher reported he is working with new and existing businesses regarding expansion. There are three new businesses being considered by the planning board.

Property Maintenance

Mr. Gallagher reported he is looking into the new County foreclosure program regarding vacant properties.

Green Efforts

Mr. Gallagher reported the Environmental Commission has made application for a silver certification for the second time.

Trash Collection

Mr. Gallagher reported there has been a reduction in solid waste by 800 tons. Recycling has increased by 300 tons, with a savings of over \$50,000.00 due to the automatic trash collection system.

Tax Assessing: **(Director Leverett)**

Committeewoman Leverett went over her report.

Farmland applications were due on August 1st, currently we are processing them. Most of farms have been inspected in April or May and periodically throughout the summer.

The added/omitted assessment book will be filed October 1st. Most of the summer has been spent doing the inspections and we have a very high volume.

The Assessor will resume farmland re-inspections after the added book is complete.

There have been a few large commercial projects completed and assessed, such as Dollar General and a few more buildings at Taylor Woods, but all are under abatement.

Senior Citizens: **(Director Leverett)**

Committeewoman Leverett went over her report.

The Seniors Association will no longer serve meals at club meetings. Meals have been discontinued and will be provided for special

occasions. Snacks & beverages will continue to be served and Birthday celebrations will continue. The Annual Tea Party will be held Sat., Sept.17, 2016 from 1:00 - 4:00 pm at the Bud Duble Center. Cost is \$10.00.

Public Safety: **(Director Mayor Wright)**

Mayor Wright reported on July 17, 2016, the Police Department's policy now includes body cameras. A pilot program for body cameras has started. The police department participated in the annual Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over program, which resulted in multiple arrests. The police department also participated in a training program at The Constitution Center in Philadelphia. The Mayor also reported Level 5 Commendations were given to Patrolmen Krauss, Ames and Schmidt for saving the life of a potential overdose victim.

Revenue and Finance: **(Director Pleczynski)**

Committeeman Pleczynski reported the deadline is extended for the property tax program until October 17. Residents 67 years or older and 100% disabled are eligible. The 2016 tax sale is scheduled on October 6th at 10:00 a.m. in the courtroom. The Township's bond is rating A-1.

Library Functions: **(Director Parette)**

Committeewoman Parette reported the library's summer reading program was a huge success, with 258 participants reading over 1,000 hours. Library cardholders now have access to programs such as Rosetta Stone. The library no longer collects late fees for cardholders 16 years and younger. In addition, the Fall newsletter is available for pick up.

Committeewoman Lawrence reported that free carbon monoxide and smoke detectors are available at the Winslow Township Fire Department. On October 19th, the WTBOH is hosting a free Breast Cancer Party at the Bud Duble Center from 6-10 pm. The American Heart Association at Cooper River Heart Walk will be held on October 22. The South Jersey Food Bank and The Perfecting Church are at School #3 on 1st Saturdays of the month.
