One item that is dear to my heart, is the addition of a Jake's Place playground at New Brooklyn County Park on Erial Road in Sicklerville. This addition to the park will help create a space for residents of all abilities to learn and play. Although this addition is only in the concept phase, it is with hope that these additions will be finalized and installed within the next 2 years. I would like to thank the Camden County Commissioners and the County Parks Department for their hours of hard work and diligence in helping this idea become a reality.

The township is working hard to improve the local roads, and several projects are either in progress or are planned for 2023. The Oak Forest pavement preservation project has begun with many of the ADA ramp improvements completed. Resurfacing is expected to take place this spring. The township has also been approved for funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation to resurface Meetinghouse Circle, Wilton's Landing Road and Prospect Road in Wilton's Corner. and traffic marking and bring the ramps up to current ADA standards. This project is anticipated to begin in late 2023 or spring of 2024.

In the way of county roadways - Cross Keys Road under construction. It is a \$7 million project. The work extends from the vicinity of the Camden County Technical School to Turnersville Road. The project includes widening the road to 5 lanes, stormwater improvements, resurfacing and traffic markings. The County has also awarded the design for the reconstruction of Mays Landing Road (which is part of Route 73) for sometime in 2024.

The township has been very diligent regarding the budget and ensuring a stable tax base. Just like costs have gone up unfortunately for your own household needs, costs have gone up over the last few years for the township as well. The Township has made multiple adjustments within each department to remain within the budget and keep services moving in a positive direction. The township works hard to do shared-services when able, and aggressively seeks out grants and low-interest loans at every opportunity. We all benefit when hard work and energy is put in to doing more within the budget allotted.

Our township is a remarkable place to live, and I am very proud of all that we have accomplished, together, over these past few years and during such difficult times. It makes me most proud however when I see the hard work and determination of our youth – who are the future leaders of our township. ZONING

Did you know that over 80% of Winslow Township residents reside within the New Jersey Pinelands?

The Pinelands are a state protected national reserve and development in this area is under strict guidelines and controlled by the Pinelands Commission. The Winslow Township Zoning Officer is the contact person for questions related to the standards for this area.

Zoning within the Pinelands area of the township is governed by the code in Chapter 296 of the Winslow Township Codebook.

Zoning for the Non-Pinelands area is governed by the code in Chapter 294.

You can visit our website to view all online codes or you may reach out to the department for specific questions.

A friendly reminder that a zoning permit is required before constructing any new structure on your property, including replacing a fence, or extending your driveway.

TOWNSHIP FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



I have a question, but I don't know what department to contact.

Winslow Township is happy to answer any questions you have, or help you resolve a problem. Don't know what department you need? No worries!

Download the My Winslow app – simply enter a ticket for the topic you have a question on, and it will automatically go to the correct department, and you will receive updates as we work on the concern or answer your question. Available 24/7 for input and also gives you access to a host of information and FAQ's!

No smart phone or wish to speak to someone directly? Simply call the township at 609-567-0700 and choose option “0” and your call will be directed.

I have more trash than will fit in my Township-issued container. What do I do?

Unfortunately, the only trash or recycling material that will be picked up by Waste Management on your scheduled day is what is placed inside the container. This is because most of the trucks are now automated. Bulk items, such as couches or mattresses, are picked up on your monthly “bulk” day (see chart on page 16).

Bulk items such as mattresses/box springs must be wrapped in plastic to be picked up. Toilets need to be separated in two pieces by unbolting the back. Metal and appliances are scheduled pick-ups (Can enter a ticket on My Winslow app or call 609-567-0700 option “2”!) and must be scheduled Monday-Thursday for a Friday pick up. No concrete, brick, dirt, topsoil, or construction type debris is picked up curb side. For these items you would need to dispose of on your own. Recycle Coach is a great tool on our website. It reminds you of trash collection, bulk collection, and other important dates.

Does the township decide what businesses come to Winslow – and where?

No! Most residential, commercial, or industrial projects you see come to Winslow Township are initiated either by the landowner or the actual entity itself that has located the parcel. On occasion the township will receive requests for potential sites with specific acreage or certain zones from entities looking to build in Winslow, but rarely does the township initiate the outreach. Regardless of how an entity comes to Winslow Township, all must still meet certain requirements and go through the normal process of the permit/site plan process and public notification.

I want to know what is happening at Township meetings. How do I know when the meetings will take place and what is on the agendas?

Winslow Township posts all agendas and meeting dates on the Township website www.winslowtownship.com – residents can see detailed information on upcoming development projects, resolutions, and more! This information is also accessible via the Township mobile app “My Winslow”.

I am interested in working for Winslow Township – what is the process?

Winslow Township is a great place to work! Want to join the team? Simply complete an application (most positions require Township residency) and email it to djacobehart@winslowtownship.com If no openings are available at that time – the Township will keep your application on file for up to 1 year. Applications can be found on the township website www.winslowtownship.com under “forms and documents” on the homepage.

Thank you for being a part of the Winslow Township Community. It is our pleasure to serve you and address any concerns that you have. The Winslow Township Police department is always open and available to address your concerns. Please do not hesitate to call 911 for emergencies or 609-561-3300 for non-emergencies.

At the beginning of the school year the Winslow Township Police Department and the Winslow Township Board of Education teamed up to add a new school resource officer to the Winslow Township Middle School. We appreciate the support we have received from the school district. Patrolman Jarel Ferren has been a great addition to the school and is already making an impact on the students and staff. Patrolman Ferren is also ready and available to address any safety concerns that parents of the middle school students may have.

The Winslow Township Police Department is also proud to announce the implementation of the L.E.A.D. program. The goal of Law Enforcement Against Drugs and Violence (L.E.A.D.) is to provide proven and effective programs to deter youth and adults from drug use, drug related crimes, bullying and violence. Our trained instructors will be working on reaching as much of the community as possible to help create awareness of the negative effects of drugs and violence.

REMINDERS

As we enter the summer months of 2023 and our children are preparing for their summer break from school, please partner with us to keep Winslow Township safe by buckling your seatbelt, following the speed limits and not utilizing your cell phones while driving.

SAFE EXCHANGE ZONE

The Winslow Township Police Department has an established "Safe Exchange Zone" in the front visitor parking lot of the Winslow Twp. Police Administration Building, located at 125 S. Rt 73 Braddock, NJ 08037. There is an area of sidewalk on the southeast corner of the visitor parking lot with yellow sidewalk markings and yellow signs marking the zone. The marked area is video recorded by state-of-the-art security cameras. It should be noted that personnel are not in the police station at all times, thus it is recommended that the zones be used during normal business hours, Monday-Friday. If this is not possible, the area is recorded and routinely patrolled.



This zone has been set up as a courtesy to and for the protection of Winslow Township residents involved in an online transaction such as a Craig's List or Online Yard Sale purchase. We do not endorse any service and only provide this area as an added layer of safety for those residents involved in online commerce.

Winslow Police officers will not intervene as witnesses, negotiators, or brokers. Our officers and civilian staff members are not permitted to provide legal advice or become involved in civil matters resulting from disputes over payment, quality, etc. The exchange of any type of weapons, destructive devices, any illicit items, controlled dangerous substances, or controlled dangerous substance paraphernalia are not permitted on our property.

While the "Safe Exchange Zone" provides an area for buyers and sellers to meet, it is important to remember that people you meet online are strangers and can pose dangers. Not every buyer or seller you meet online is someone who is true with their intent. When making arrangements to complete online transactions face-to-face, residents should be reminded to:

- Complete all transactions during daylight hours, if possible
- Bring a cell phone in case of emergency
- Notify friends or family about the details of the exchange beforehand
- Never invite strangers to your home or agree to meet at a stranger's home
- Reconsider any transaction with an individual who refuses to meet at a designated "Internet Purchase Exchange Zone"

Taking these simple precautions helps make these types of in person transactions safer for everyone in our communities.

HOUSE NUMBERS – HELP FIRST RESPONDERS FIND YOU!

The owner, occupant, or lessee of each home, store or other building must display house/building numbers. Please ensure all buildings are clearly marked as indicated below so emergency personnel can quickly locate each property:

- In Arabic (clearly visible) numerals.
- A minimum height of three (3) inches.
- Mounted in a secure fashion to the front wall or porch of the building to be clearly visible from the street.

If your home or building is setback from the roadway, the owner must provide a post or rod (which can include a mailbox), with the number affixed and visible from the street upon which the building fronts.

JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY INFORMATION

The Winslow Township Police Department is excited to bring back the Junior Police Academy tier 1 and tier 2 programs. The tier 1 academy is for township residents between the ages 11-14 years old. The tier 2 program is for township residents between the ages of 12-15 years old that have already completed tier 1 (certain exceptions may apply). **The tentative dates for the academy are:**

Tier 1 July 10th-14th

Tier 2 July 17th-21st

SMART ENERGY NETWORK FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Beginning Fall 2023, Winslow Township residents will begin receiving new Smart Meter upgrades. This upgrade comes as part of Atlantic City Electric's effort to build a new Smart Energy Network throughout its service area, which will enhance the reliability of your energy service, provide better information during outages and support new tools and programs to help you save money and energy. A full list of frequently asked questions can be found at atlanticcityelectric.com/SEN or on the Township website at www.winslowtownship.com (under Announcements on the homepage).



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Some things to keep in mind:

- You will receive a post card within of a few months of your upgrade and a letter within a few weeks of your installation. Approximately one week prior to your meter upgrade, Atlantic City Electric will call to remind you that your meter is scheduled for an upgrade. You can also receive reminders by signing up for text alerts in My Account at atlanticcityelectric.com/MyAccount or through Atlantic City Electric's mobile app.
- On the day of your meter upgrade, a representative from Atlantic City Electric's upgrade contractor, CCI, will knock on your door to let you know that your upgrade will take place. The contractor will carry approved Atlantic City Electric identification.
- You do not need to be home for the upgrade. However, if you normally need to give a meter reader access to your meter, please contact Atlantic City Electric at 1-800-642-3780 to schedule an appointment. Your meter location will also not be moved.
- Upgrades will take place Monday through Friday and will take no more than 30 minutes.
- You may experience a brief service outage lasting no more than a few minutes while the new meter is being installed. **If there is any life-support equipment in use at this address, it is important that you notify us prior to your meter upgrade by calling 1-800-642-3780.**
- Atlantic City Electric will leave a doorhanger letting you know that the upgrade was completed. If the upgrade is unable to be completed, the doorhanger will provide a number to call for an appointment.

TAX COLLECTIONS

A few words and tips from the Tax Collectors office.

We will start by welcoming our newest team member Tina Harris to the Tax collector's office. Tina is eager to assist the residents with payments at the window and assistance with questions over the phone or via email. Stop by and say hello to Tina the next time you are in the building. The main function of the Tax collector's office is the billing and collection of property taxes within the Township. Taxes are due on a quarterly basis on the first day of February, May, August, and November. There is always a 10-day grace period before interest is charged. The 2023 Final/2024 Preliminary Tax bills will be mailed out in July. These bills are prepared as soon as we are issued a tax rate.

If you are a new resident, please contact our office to make sure we have the correct mailing address. Our property ownership records are updated once the County has recorded the deed. This process can take a couple of months. Unfortunately, not receiving a tax bill does not preclude you from owing the taxes or being charged interest on late payments. Contact us to avoid this issue. We do not like to see this happen to any of our residents.

Taxes can be paid in person Monday thru Friday from 8:30 to 4:30. A drop box is available 24/7 for your convenience in the Police entrance. Please NO CASH in the drop box. You may also pay by phone 1-844-611-4022. Please note you will need a PIN number to pay by phone, which the Tax Collections Office can provide. This service is also available to pay your utility bill by phone 1-844-611-4018, however a different PIN number is needed to pay a utility bill by phone. You may also pay online through your bank or the 3rd party service WIPP, available on the township website. The Collections Office can also assist with questions and applications for tax deductions and other programs that may be available to residents. Please call to see if you may be eligible for any programs.

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Address Leaking Faucets, Outside Hose Bibs and Toilet Tank Flappers

Water Waste per 90 Days 60 PSI

A 1/4" leak wastes 13,127 gallons in 24 hours x 90 days	=	1,181,430 gallons
A 3/16" leak wastes 7,400 gallons in 24 hours x 90 days	=	666,000 gallons
A 1/8" leak wastes 3,288 gallons in 24 hours x 90 days	=	295,920 gallons
A 1/16" leak wastes 882 gallons in 24 hours x 90 days	=	73,980 gallons

The smallest continuous leak, the size of a pencil point, will add a considerable amount to your quarterly water bill.

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OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPAL CLERK

The Clerk's Office is a major source of information for our residents. The Municipal Clerk and her staff serve as a liaison between the community and the township.

What types of licenses does the Clerk's Office issue?

Kennel licenses, pet licenses, shooting gallery & range licenses, towing licenses, trailer court licenses, bingo/raffle licenses, business licenses, solicitor's licenses, alarm permits, yard sale permits, taxicab licenses, limousine licenses, clothing bin licenses and liquor licenses.

Who do I contact to use a Township field or park?

The Clerk's Office issues permits for the use of Township parks and/or fields for sports teams and residents.

How can I get a copy of a public record?

The Municipal Clerk is responsible for and processes all Open Public Records Applications (OPRA). OPRA requests are responded to within seven (7) business days.

Where can I register to vote?

The Municipal Clerk is the Administrator of Elections and forms are available to register to vote, change party affiliation and request vote by mail ballots.

Do you have non-profit group and need a place meet?

The Clerk's office also schedules the use the Bud Duble Senior Center and the Star Building.

Any other services provided by the Clerk's Office?

We also offer free notary service.

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CODE ENFORCEMENT AND ANIMAL CONTROL INFORMATION

Winslow Township has 3 full time Code Enforcement Officers who investigate a wide variety of requests - which include reports of high grass, abandoned or vacant properties, property maintenance issues (examples below).

Accessory Structure(s)

All accessory structures, including detached garages, fences, and walls, shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair.

Mattress Disposal

Mattresses and box springs shall be placed in separate plastic (polyethylene) bags, also known as mattress bags or mattress moving and storage bags, prior to being placed at the curb.

Swimming Pool

The owner of every pool is responsible to maintain their pool in such condition as to prevent nuisance affecting public health and safety (i.e., stagnant water in which mosquitos breed).

Restriction on time of placement and removal of trash containers

No trash, garbage or recyclable shall be placed at the point designated for collection at or near any street, or other public place earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the day before the designated day for collection, and shall be removed no later than 6:00 p.m. the day after the designated day for collection.

Property Maintenance Issue

Properties within the township must be maintained and well kept. If you notice a property with fence, gutters, soffits et cetera in disrepair, or if there is a general disrepair of the home (i.e., debris and junk around property).



Animal Control

Renew your pet licenses. Your current license expired December 31, 2022. Registration of animals after March 31st will be considered late, and a \$25.00 late fee will be charged in addition to the regular license fee per animal

Pet licenses can be obtained by completing the application on the township website at www.winslowtownship.com under the forms and documents section for the Clerk's Office.

Winslow Township has 2 full time Animal Control Officers who respond to a multitude of calls. Their primary objective is public health and safety – as well as the safe and humane care of animals within Winslow Township.

Class III Animals

An animal of Class III would be fowl such as any feathered vertebrate animal, including, but not limited to, chickens, turkeys, ducks, hens, cocks, pheasants, or any other animal commonly referred to as “barnyard fowl.” This class of animal shall also include pigeons.

The keeping or housing of animals of Class III within the Township of Winslow is permitted by permit only -issued by the Township Clerk pursuant to an application made by the owner of such animal. The standards applied for consideration and issuance of such a special permit shall include but not be limited to the following:

1. Only permitted in non-residential and agricultural areas, with a minimum lot size of 2 acres.
2. No stable, building or enclosure shall be closer than 50 feet to any other property line. This distance may be decreased or increased depending on the type animal, number of animals, property size and other pertinent factors of the application.
3. Consideration to the number and type of animals proposed to be kept in relationship to the size of the property in question.
4. The type of stable, building or enclosure to be utilized for the keeping of such animals, together with other factors relating to maintaining such animals, i.e., cleaning and disposal of waste.
5. The zoning and character of property within 200 feet.
6. Assurance that all stables, buildings, or enclosures are cleaned of all waste, manure, garbage and other materials and the waste, manure, garbage, and fecal material is removed from the premises or treated in such a manner as to prevent odor and the attraction of rodents or insects and that all stables, buildings, or enclosures are sprayed or disinfected in order to prevent flies, fleas, insects and rodents.

Winslow Township **Code Enforcement and Animal Control** are ready to assist. If you wish to report a non-urgent matter to **Code Enforcement or Animal Control** you may do so by going to the online winslowtownship.com under “Service Request”. Funding Capital Projects Through Grants

The Township is always aggressive in finding funding sources other than debt service to fund capital and infrastructure projects. Over the past 6 fiscal years, the Township has been allocated approximately 7 million dollars in grants. The American Rescue Plan allocations from 2021 and 2022 have allowed us to fund over two million dollars on water and sewer projects, a three-million-dollar congressional grant was awarded for renovations to the West Atco Community Center, and over a half million dollars in Department of Transportation grants have been awarded for improvements to roads. Various annual grants allow us to run Clean Communities Programs, Municipal Drug and Alcohol Alliance programs and several others that save taxpayer dollars.

FROM THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

As of January 1, 2023, Winslow Township welcomed our new Municipal Tax Assessor, Darlene Campbell. Mrs. Campbell has been in the Assessing field since 1997 and received her Certified Tax Assessors License in July of 2003. On December 31, 2022, Theresa Stagliano retired as the Municipal Tax Assessor. Ms. Stagliano was employed with Winslow Township for 36 years. Congratulations to them both!

Did you know:

1. You cannot appeal your property taxes.

You can only appeal the assessed value of your property, and this value cannot be compared to other assessments. You must compare the value to the market value of properties similar to yours that have sold within the last year between October 1 and October 1 of the pretax year.

2. Mailing address changes must be submitted in writing. Address change forms can be found on the Assessors page of the Township website.

3. All property ownership information must be obtained through the Camden County Board of Taxation.

Farmland Assessment Act of 1964

Requires owners to apply annually for Farmland Assessment. Farmland Applications must be filed in duplicate with the Tax Assessor no later than August 1st of the pretax year. Applications received after August 1st may be denied. Farmland applications will be sent out by our office to property owners currently receiving



farmland assessment in the middle of June. All sections of the forms must be completed by the property owner before submitting to our office. The assessor's office will be inspecting farms for qualifying activity over the next few months. Properties that do not meet the prerequisites may be subject to Roll-Back Taxes. For properties that do not currently have farmland assessment, it is the responsibility of the property owner to call and request an application, which is also due back August 1st. More information on farmland assessment can be found on our website.

Property Tax Deductions

The State of New Jersey, administered through the Assessor's Office, provides property tax deductions to Veterans, Widows of Veterans, Senior Citizens, Disabled Persons and Widows of Seniors and Disabled Persons. Each deduction has specific qualifications/prerequisites that must be met and requires the filing of an application. Please feel free to call the Assessor's Office 609-567-0700 option #9, and we will mail you an application along with written instructions and/or answer your questions. Property owners who are currently receiving these deductions do not need to reapply.

To our residents: We **THANK YOU** for all of the support you continue to show our organization to meet the needs in providing community fire and rescue protection. We responded to 2,057 calls for help in 2022 and supported the community in many other ways. We are a combination Fire Department consisting of both Volunteer and Career firefighters serving the community 24/7 from 5 fire stations covering nearly 60 square miles. Along with responding to calls, the Fire Department is very engaged in the community; participating in public education/relations events, supporting many charity events and Fire Code Enforcement, along with an aggressive free smoke alarm inspection program for residents who qualify. In our organization we have a division known as the Second Responders. While they support many Fire Department activities, they also support community needs such as Holiday Food Drives, Children's gifts for Christmas, hygiene kits for those who experience residential fire loss and many other selfless acts. In 2022 alone, they were able to support approximately 75 families.

We would like to remind everyone to change the batteries in their smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms and replace alarms older than 10 years. An operable detector is truly a lifesaver! If you need battery-operated smoke alarms please contact our Fire Marshal's office for more information. Clean your dryer vents on a regular basis, practice home and workplace fire escape drills and be mindful of hazards in the kitchen as well as candle use. We would also like to ask you to keep your address posted and well visible to view from the street to assist us in finding you.

The Fire Department is continuously trying to recruit interested individuals to volunteer and join our team to protect OUR Community. We are in significant need of Volunteer Firefighters as they make up a considerable portion of our organization.

The Winslow Township Construction Office is responsible for ensuring all construction work in the township complies with the requirements of the New Jersey Uniform Construction Code. Work done without the required permits may result in a penalty up to \$2000.00 weekly. Residents are urged to contact the Construction Office prior to beginning home improvement projects to inquire if a permit is required.



IMPORTANT: ATTENTION LANDLORDS

The State of New Jersey enacted P.L. 2021, c.182 on July 22, 2022, requiring rental dwelling units constructed prior to January 1, 1978 to be inspected for lead-based paint hazards (unless otherwise exempt under the law). 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What is a Certified Copy of a Vital Record and do I need one?

A Certified Copy is an Official State document with the raised seal. Did you get married in Winslow Township? Were you born in Winslow Township? Did a family member pass here in Winslow Township? If you were married or born here and if a family member passed here, our Vital Records Office should have a copy of your Vital Record. All Vital Records are kept in the place where the event occurred in the State of New Jersey along with the State Registrar's office.



Do you need a Certified copy of your Vital Record?

Vital Records are not public record. New Jersey law protects and restricts the release of Vital Records. If the event (Marriage, Death, Birth) occurred in Winslow Township, the Vital Record can be obtained through this office. The Registrar or Deputy Registrar must authenticate the identity of the person requesting the record and their relationship with the subject of the vital record. The person requesting a vital record must provide the EXACT NAME, THE EXACT PLACE AND THE EXACT DATE for the vital record being requested. Below are three ways in which we can assist you in obtaining a Marriage License, Birth and/or Death Certificate.

- E-mail the completed application along with a clear copy of your driver's license or required documentation for your requested vital record. You can now pay for the certified copies over the phone (credit/debit). Once the documentation has been received, verified and a payment made the certified copies will be mailed.
- Mail the completed application along with a check or money order- made out to Winslow Township- and a clear copy of your driver's license or needed documentation. Once received and processed your certified copies will be mailed.
- Make an appointment to come in-person. Bring the necessary identification needed for the vital record. Once the application has been completed and paid for, you will leave with your certified copies.
- The cost for each Certified Copy is \$10.00

The application for a Certified copy is located on Winslow Township website under Department/ Health and Vitals. Vital Records Office is located in the modular behind the Main Building.

WHAT EXACTLY IS A RAIN BARREL?

A rain barrel is a system that collects and stores rain water from your roof that would otherwise be lost to runoff and diverted to storm drains, streams, and eventually the Delaware River watershed. It is constructed using a reused 55 gallon food grade barrel, a bottom drain, a spigot, an overflow a screen to keep debris and insects out, and a downspout diverter to carry the water into the rain barrel.

A rain barrel is a relatively simple and inexpensive way to capture and store rain water for use at later times. It conveniently sits under residential gutter downspouts from you home, garage, and/or shed.

BENEFITS OF USING A RAIN BARREL

Lawn and garden watering can take up a large percentage or total percentage of total household water use during the summer months. A rain barrel collects water and stores it for when you need it most, during periods of drought! A rain barrel provides an ample supply of FREE water for flowers, gardens, lawns, and even car washing!

A rain barrel can conserve water ad save YOU money during peak summer months. Conserving water helps protect the environment, saves energy (decreased demand for treated tap water and well water) and decreased the impact of runoff to streams and the Delaware River. Therefore by installing a rain barrel YOU can help protect the water quality, aquatic species, drinking water quality, and recreation in the Delaware River watershed.

A formula to remember: 1 inch of rain on a 1,000 sq. ft. roof yields 623 gallons of water. Calculate the yield of your roof by multiplying the square footage of your roof by 623 and divide by 1,000.

Driver Licenses

The Mobile Units provide the opportunity for drivers to renew their license, obtain a duplicate license, change their name or address on their license, add a boat endorsement, add a veteran designation, register to vote and/or make organ donation selections.

Non-Driver Identification Cards

The Mobile Units can provide residents with photo identification that may then serve as a primary or secondary form of personal ID.

Registrations

Drivers may renew their registration or obtain a duplicate registration card for their vehicle in the Mobile Units.

REAL ID

Mobile units can provide **REAL ID** to a limited number of customers. Customers that have scheduled appointments for **REAL IDs** must arrive no later than 12:30pm, the day of appointment.

License Plates
