This will be held at the Winslow Township Senior Center (Bud Duble Center) located at 33 Cooper Folly Road in Atco, NJ next to the Camden County Library System: South County Regional Branch. This event is **FREE** and open to the public. This drive is expected to feed 250 families (while supplies last).
