U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY REVIEWS CLEANUP FOR THE KING OF PRUSSIA SUPERFUND SITE

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is conducting its sixth five-year review of the **King of Prussia Superfund site** located in Winslow Township, Camden County, New Jersey. This review seeks to confirm that the cleanup conducted at these sites continue to be protective of people's health and the environment.

The cleanup approach for the groundwater contamination includes extracting and treating the water, then reinjecting the water into the ground. This also includes sampling surface water and sediment in the Great Egg Harbor River.

A summary of the cleanup activities and an evaluation of their protectiveness will be included in the five-year review report. The report will be available by **spring 2025.**

What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

The EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of people's health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspecting the site and cleanup technologies;
- Reviewing monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records; and
- Determining if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
